Terms of Sale

- 1) This is a mail bid sale. Bids may be made by mail, Email, telephone, or fax. All bids must be received by 8:00PM EST March 5, 2016. However, I will accept telephone bids for a short time after 8:00PM to accommodate phone bidders who received a busy signal prior to the end of the auction. By submitting bids you agree to the Terms of Sale.
- 2) All lots will be sold to the highest bidder. Bids will be treated as limits and will be reduced as competition permits. Bids of less than 60% of the estimate will not be accepted. Bids are to be made in whole dollar amounts only, and those that include cents will be rounded up to the next dollar.
- 3) Bidders unknown to us must supply two acceptable trade references or a 25% deposit along with their bids.
- 4) A 15% buyer's premium will be added to the cost of each lot.
- 5) All shipping and insurance charges will be added to the buyer's invoice. There will be a \$1.00 charge per lot for packing and processing, with a \$2 minimum per invoice.
- 6) Connecticut sales tax of 6.35% will be added to the total purchase price of all lots delivered in Connecticut. Any other regional taxes, duties, or fees are the responsibility of the bidder.
- 7) Payment in U.S. dollars is due upon receipt of invoice. Title to all lots remains with the cataloguer until paid for in full. We reserve the right to withhold shipment of lots until full payment is received. Invoices may also be paid via Paypal (3% surcharge applies). A late payment fee of 2% per month will be charged to accounts not paid within 30 days of the sale.
- 8) This is not an approval sale. No lot may be returned without our written permission. Any request for such must be made within 3 days of receipt of lots. The 12/07/1863 letter announces the then-upcoming sale of the J. P. W. Neff collection, in which "everything *must* be sold". Of greater interest is the letter of 1/01/1864, which announces that a 1792 silver Disme will be a supplemental lot offered on the second day of the same sale. Cogan stated "a *Disme* of 1792, in *Silver*...the most interesting as well as the rarest Coin, that has yet been offered for sale at public auction...made from some silver sent to the Mint by George Washington, for the purpose of having a pattern struck for a Disme". Kolbe & Fanning postulated that this may have been the first time that the legend of the origin of this coin (and half dismes) was put into print. Interestingly, Cogan also announced that "when I purchased it there were several scratches upon it, which have been very carefully removed, and the Coin is now in very excellent condition".
